The club offers a variety of exercise and recreational opportunities. The fitness center will offer free weights and exercise machines. Space is also reserved for yoga and Pilates classes. Men's and women's locker rooms are adjacent to the fitness center, and on the other side the swimming pool overlooks the first tee.
